On the 50th anniversary of the Six Day War, modern Israel is in search of its future. Looking forward requires us to re-engage with our past, to explore its meaning and consequences, and decide what we should embrace, what needs re-interpretation, and from what we should break free.

#HartmanSummer 2017 will address some of the most significant challenges and questions facing modern Israel, reimagining the claims of our past, and imagining the possibilities for our future, through lectures, seminars, day trips, and special programs.

For the past sixteen years the Shalom Hartman Institute has been hosting lay leaders from around the world to study texts with world-renowned scholars, learn about current Israeli policies and politics, and explore Israel. Each year, the Shalom Hartman Institute hosts over 150 lay leaders to study a specific topic. (Over 150 rabbis study the same topic following the Community Leadership Program (CLP) program, in the Rabbinic Torah Study Seminar (RTS).
